- At playtime and lunchtime, I will be with my little class of friends and need to keep to a special area of the field or my playground and my teacher will show me where this is. If I have friends in a different class, then I will be able to wave to them from a distance.
- I will be taught in a smaller class, which may be in a different classroom and with a different teacher, but school have told my parents/carers who that teacher will be, and my teacher will know all about me even if they haven't taught me before.
- I must keep washing my hands for at least 20 seconds.
- If I am going to sneeze or cough, I must do this into a tissue then put the tissue in the special bin and wash my hands.
- I must try to stay two metres away from my friends and teachers.

Going back to school will be fun. I must try to remember that the changes are to keep me safe, and my teachers will remind me of what I need to do. My teachers and my adults at home will be proud of me for trying to remember what I need to do to keep safe at school.
