Leadership Team




We have recently reviewed our current leadership team and will be operating under a slightly different structure from September. The new structure will be:


Fond Farewells:



Reading Books!



Children in KS1-It's the summer holidays and your child has made super progress this year. Let's keep them reading to ensure your child doesn't fall behind over the summer break.

Listen to your child read every day

You will find we have organised some *Read Write Inc.* Storybooks for your child to read to you over the holidays. Choose a quiet time when they are wide awake.

Help your child to:

- read the sounds and words at the front of the book, before they read the story
- sound out any new words as they read the story. Read back each page to them, after they have read it. If the child has enjoyed the story, encourage them to read it again on the next day to **increase their fluency**. Most importantly...do it all with patience and love.
- **Read to your child every day** Did you know that *being read to* develops children's comprehension and love of reading?

Thank you for your support with this. 5 weeks without reading will result in your child's progress regressing . They are currently at a vital stage of their reading journey so daily practice is so important. Thank you.


