














## Science: Year 1 Spring 2

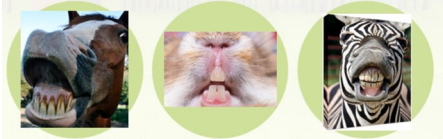
### What animals are there and what do they eat?

Bird	Animals with a beak, two legs, feathers and wings.
Reptile	Breathe air, have scales on their bodies and lay eggs.
Amphibian	Live in the water as babies and on land as adults. Amphibians have slimy skin.
Mammal	Breathe air, grow hair or fur and feed on mother's milk as a baby.
Fish	Live and breather underwater. Have fins, scales and gills.
carnivore	An animal that only eats other animals.
herbivore	An animal that only eats plants.
omnivore	An animal that eats other animals and plants.

What do animals eat?		
Herbivores are animals that only eat plants.	Carnivores are animals that eat other animals.	Omnivores are animals that eat plants and other animals.

### What do animal teeth look like? How do herbivores, carnivores and omnivores eat their food?

**Herbivores** have **blunt, flat** teeth so they can crush and grind the plants.



**Carnivores** have **sharp, pointy** teeth to rip and tear the meat. They can rip meat with their sharp claws or beaks.



**Omnivores** have **blunt and pointy** teeth to rip meat and crush plants.
