Fantastic Fundraising!

Considerations for next year.

- School bags/ rucksacks- we have very limited space available in the classroom for rucksacks. All packed lunches go on a trolley before going into the classroom and PE kits stay on the children's pegs in the classroom in a small bag. Water bottles have their own spots in the classroom and KS2 children have trays to keep reading books etc. Please keep any bags to an absolute minimum size.
- Pencil cases and stationery- children do not need any pencil cases or stationery as we provide everything needed in school.
- We have some school uniform stock in the school office, if you need new items, please pop in to see Mrs Buttery.

Fidgets and Toys

We have seen an increasing number of children bringing in fidgets and toys into school. While we understand that fidgets and small toys can be helpful for some children in specific situations, they often become distractions in the classroom. These items can take students' attention away from learning, disrupt others, and even lead to unnecessary conflicts or lost items. To maintain a focused and respectful learning environment, we kindly ask that students leave all toys and non-essential items at home unless they are part of a documented support plan. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Teacher vs Kids Football

Last week, after the children enthusiastically requested it, Mr Davenport and Mrs Wales kindly organised a staff verse kids football match. On the day, spirits were high, the children were confident they would be victorious and as the bell rang for 3:30, excitement rolled through the corridors. Rushcliffe Family Hub

Welcome to the Family Hub in Nottinghamshire!

The Family Hub is your friendly, one-stop support centre for families in our area. Whether you're expecting a baby, caring for a toddler, or parenting a teenager, the Hub has something for everyone.

- A 'front door' to help Offering seamless access to essential services under one roof, including antenatal and postnatal care, health and development clinics, parenting classes, speech and language support, services for children with SEND, and even help with housing, finances or mental well-being.
- Tailored to local needs Each Hub is unique. You might visit a purpose-built building or connect through community venues, schools, libraries—or online via the Virtual Family Hub, available around the clock.
- **Support for all families** Open to everyone: from pregnancy through early years to adolescence (up to age 19, or 25 for young people with SEND). Professionals and volunteers work together with partners like health services, schools, and charities, ensuring you only share your story once and get the right help at the right time.
- Community-focused roll-out Nottinghamshire launched its first pilot in Retford in 2023, and new Hubs have since opened across the county. By spring 2025, all former children's centre teams will have transformed into Family Hub networks—including main sites and local "spokes" for easy access.

The aim? To strengthen our community, support families early, and help every child thrive through joined-up, caring services that grow with you.

Building a Better KPNS: Update

We're pleased to share a positive update on the refurbishment project currently underway at Keyworth Primary and Nursery School.

Since work began in June, our contractors, Zeno, have made amazing progress. If you've passed the site recently, you'll likely have seen just how much of the first stage has already been completed — it's a great sign of what's to come. We're particularly excited that the cladding, which will give the school a smart, refreshed appearance, is scheduled to be fitted over the summer.

The project remains on track for completion by early October, with key improvements including better thermal insulation and upgraded fire protection — all contributing to a safer, more comfortable learning environment for our children.

We'd like to extend our sincere thanks to local residents, especially those on Manor Road and Rose Hill, for your continued patience and support during this period. It's very much appreciated.

As a reminder, site access continues via the rear entrance on Manor Road, with a small fenced area in use at the back of the rear playground for materials and equipment. While deliveries are carefully managed, we ask for your continued cooperation with parking and access along Manor Road, particularly during weekday mornings.

Talking to Children About Strangers


Help your child stay safe by keeping messages simple and clear:

- A stranger is anyone they don't know well not just someone who "looks scary."
- If someone makes them feel unsafe, they should Yell, Run, Tell.
- If approached or offered gifts, they should always tell a trusted adult, even if told to keep it secret.
- Teach your children your mobile number.
- If lost, they should stand still and wait or ask a safe adult such as a shop worker, police officer, or a parent with children.


