
The Keyworth Code

Safety First: Helmets for Every Ride!

We encourage all parents to remind their children to wear a properly fitted bicycle helmet every time they ride to and from school. Helmets are the most effective way to prevent serious head injuries in the event of a fall or accident, even on short or familiar routes. Children should not be coming to school on a bike or scooter without a helmet. Thank you for supporting us to keep your children safe.

Attention All Year 6 Parents!!



Year 6 parents – The window is now open for secondary school applications for September 2026. If your child lives in Nottinghamshire and requires a secondary school place in September 2026, you must apply through Nottinghamshire County Council. Check your home local authority at http://www.gov.uk/find-local-council

The best way to apply is online at www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk/admissions If you can't apply online, please call 0300 500 80 80 and speak with a call centre advisor at Nottinghamshire County Council.

The window closes on 31st October 2025 and you are advised to list 4 preferences. If you do not apply before 31st October 2025, your application will be considered as 'late' and processed after all 'on time' applications have been allocated. This could mean that your child is allocated a place a long way away. Please note that South Wolds Academy and 6th Form, Rushcliffe School and West Bridgford School are all very popular and are likely to be full from 'on time' applications.

IMPORTANT: If you're thinking about applying for a school **outside your catchment area**, please get in touch with us first. This is important because if your application isn't successful, your child could be offered a place at a school you haven't chosen. We can talk you through how the process works and help you make the best choices for your family.

At the start of the new school year, we would like to take this opportunity to remind all families about the important changes to our attendance policy. These changes came into effect last academic year in line with updated national statutory guidelines, which all schools are required to follow. For new parents and carers, this may be the first time you are receiving this information.

The purpose of these changes is to support the best possible outcomes for every child. To help you understand and follow the new expectations, we have introduced an online form for requesting leave of absence. Please see below for key documents and links:

We strongly encourage all parents and carers to read the summary or full policy. Please be aware that the government's new expectations are highly stringent and may result in an increase in penalty notices or legal action where attendance is poor.

We want to reassure you that we value our strong partnership with parents and carers. While some of these changes may feel challenging at times, they are statutory requirements for all schools. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we work together to support your child's education.

Once you complete your Bronze Reading Award Page, show your teacher and you will receive your reward. Don't forget, we don't start silver until after Christmas!



Safeguarding Tips for Parents

Stranger Awareness and Safety

It's important to consistently remind children about staying safe around people they don't know.

Key safety messages include:

- Do not speak to or go with anyone they do not know.
- Never accept lifts, gifts, or invitations from strangers.
- Go straight home or to their agreed pick-up point.
- Tell a trusted adult immediately if they are approached.

We kindly ask that you reinforce these messages at home so children feel confident about what to do if they are ever unsure.
