A Message from Inspector Tim Cuthbert (Neighbourhood Policing, Rushcliffe)



We are aware of several incidents which have been called in to Nottinghamshire Police by parents relating to issues or peer conflict (fallout between children) within the school. Incidents such as these should be reported to the school, as Police involvement is often simply not appropriate, and may indeed be detrimental to the social development of all children involved. These incidents are not to be called in to the Police.

There are extensive, and thorough safeguarding processes in place within Keyworth Primary & Nursery School, routinely audited, overseen by Equals Trust, and supported by further oversight from the board of governors. The Police should not be contacted as an alternative to speaking to the school, and inappropriate calls to the Police will likely be referred straight back to the school to manage themselves, as this is the most appropriate, and correct course of action.

Notts Police are also aware that when calls have been made to the Police due to peer conflict between children, some parents are taking to social media to broadcast Police involvement as an indicator of the severity of an incident. This is not helpful for the school in managing child wellbeing, the parents of those involved, or indeed the children themselves.

While this was not a formal review or inspection, the feedback and discussion was positive and supported our approach. We will, as always, continue to reflect on our practice and work closely with families and external partners to ensure a safe and supportive environment for all pupils.

Spring Doodle Challenge

Between the 1st April and the 30th April, we invite students to join one or both of our exciting Spring Challenges — the DoodleMaths Challenge and the DoodleEnglish Challenge!

The Challenges will run from Wednesday 1st April to Thursday 30th April. The last day to start the Challenges will be on Friday 24th April (as one requirement is 7 active Doodling days).

Children need to earn 450 stars (or 350 stars if they were born after August 2018) and use DoodleMaths and/or DoodleEnglish for 7 days* between the 1st April - 30th April. Parents at home can print keep track of their child's progress by downloading our [free tracker sheet](#).

*These days do not need to be in a row, so your students can use Doodle whenever they'd like throughout April. A day of use is counted as completing at least one exercise (an x-a-day, Power-up, Tricky, Assignment or baseline assessment exercise) between 00:01 and 23:59. The stars do not need to be earned solely in these 7 days; they can be earned across the whole challenge period.

Safeguarding Tips for Parents

Easter Holiday Safety: Staying Safe at Home, Out and Online

The Easter holiday is a lovely chance for children to relax, play and spend time with family. At the same time, changes to routine can mean **more time online, greater independence, and increased access to devices and TV without adult supervision.**

A few simple checks can help:

- **Stay involved.** Know what your child is watching, playing and who they are talking to — especially when using devices or streaming services independently.
- **Keep content age-appropriate.** Check ratings on apps, games and TV programmes, and use parental controls where possible.
- **Notice changes.** Becoming secretive with devices, unusually worried, upset or withdrawn can be signs something is not right.
- **Check safety settings.** Review privacy settings, location sharing and app permissions.
- **Plan outings carefully.** Agree meeting points, who children are with, and what to do if plans change.
- **Encourage speaking up.** Remind your child they can always tell you or another trusted adult if something feels wrong.
